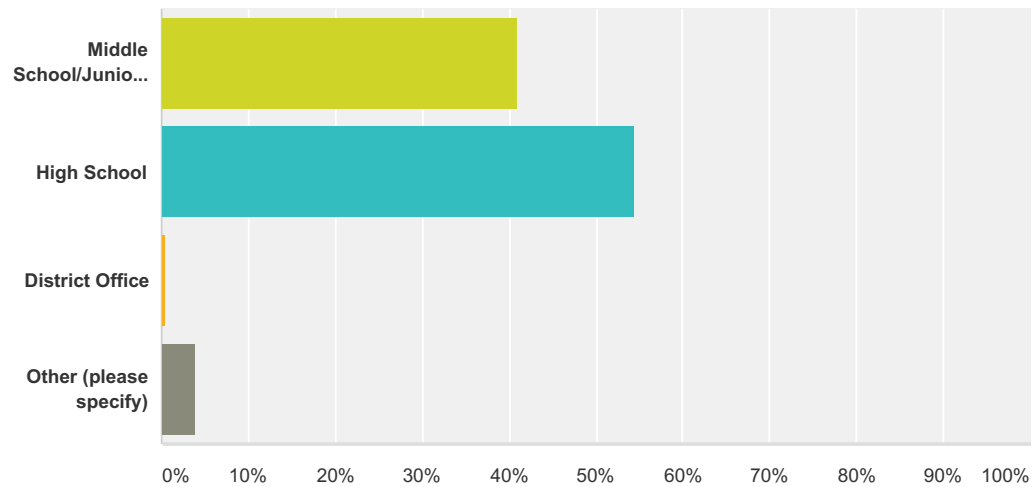

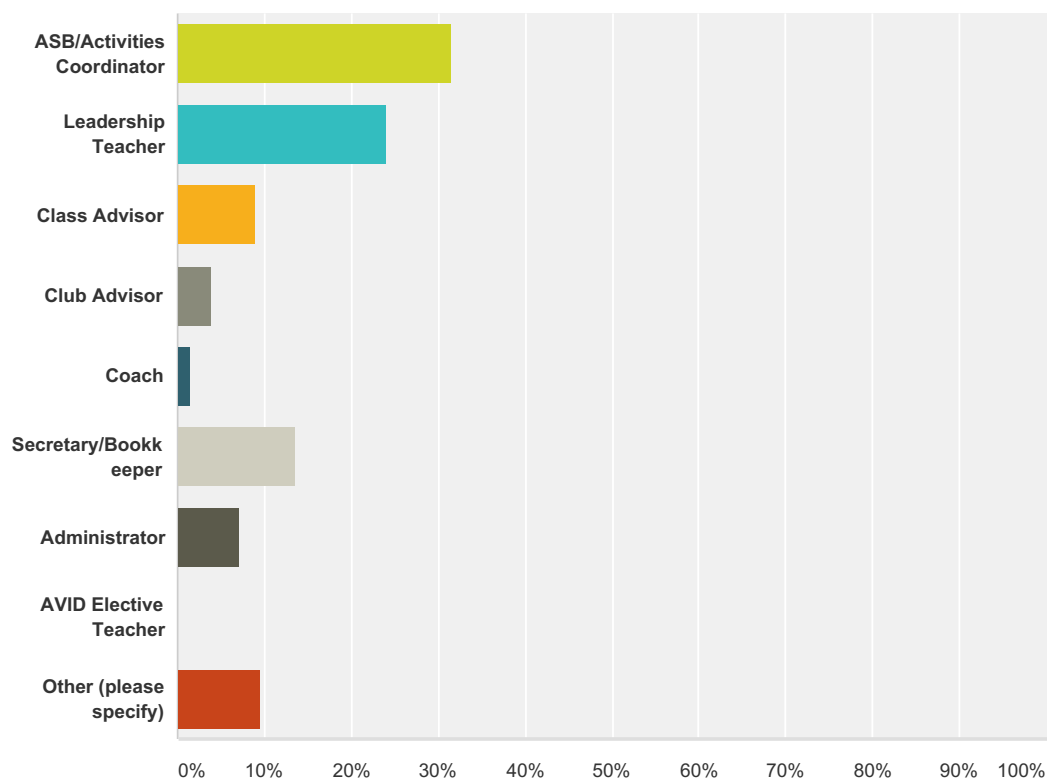

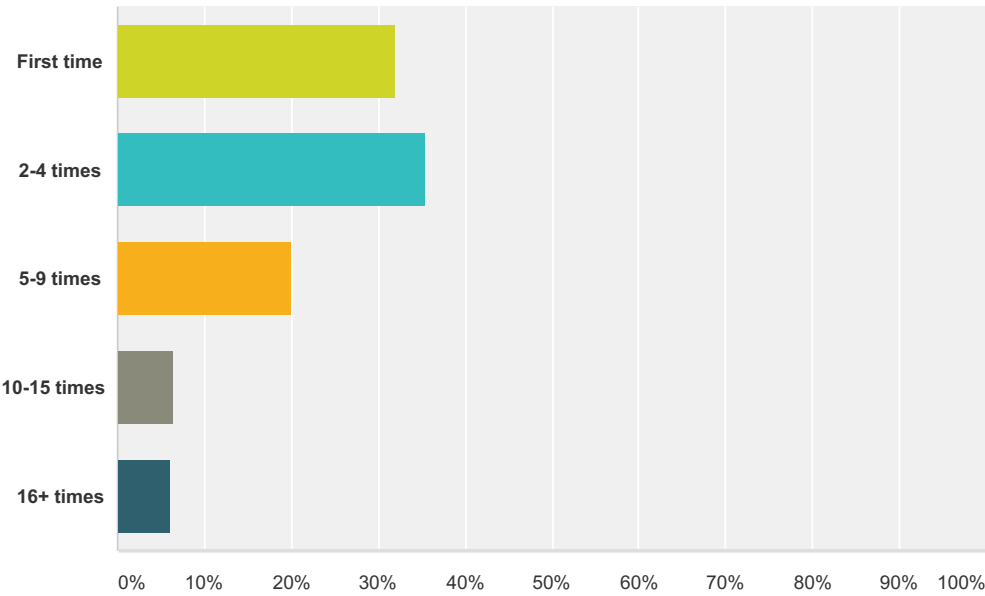

Q3 Number of times you have attended the WACA Conference?

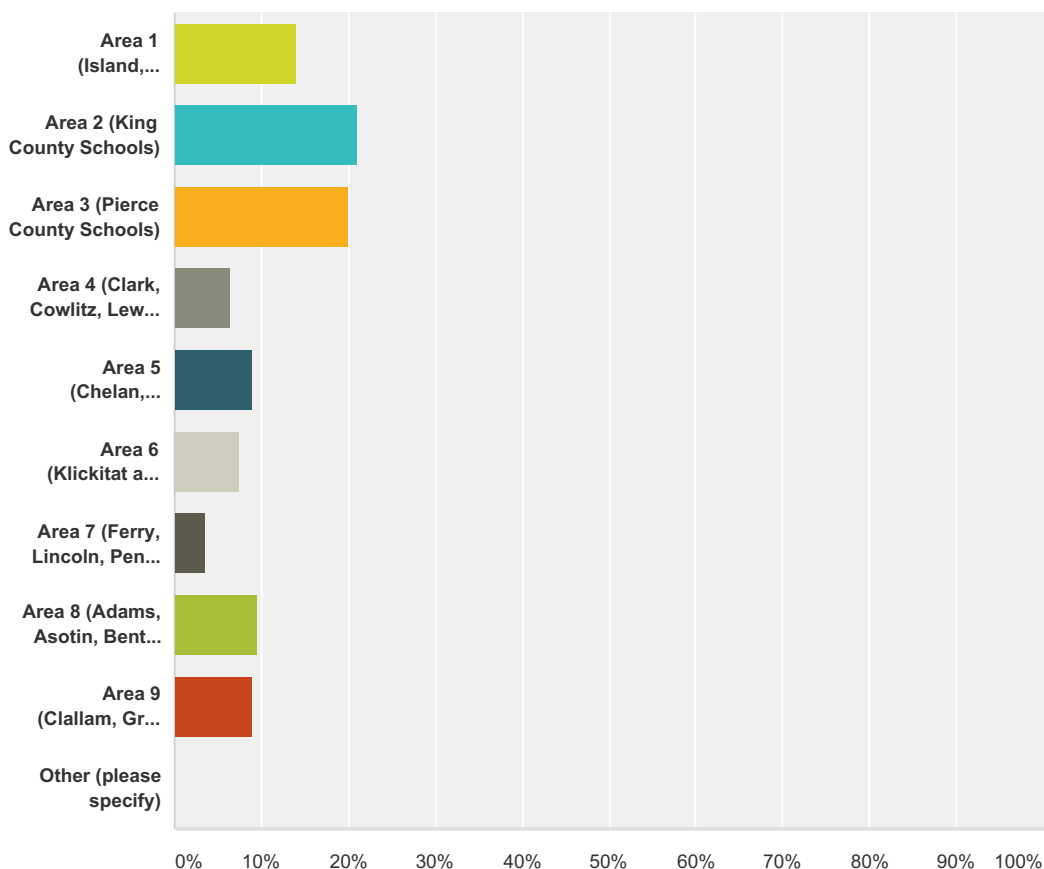

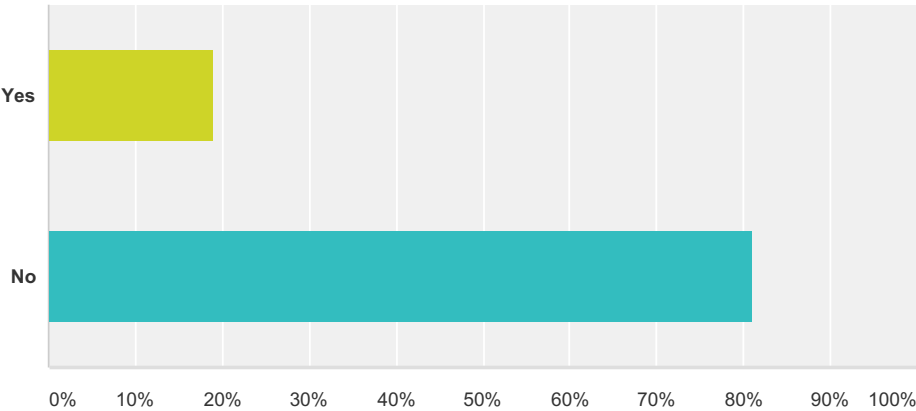

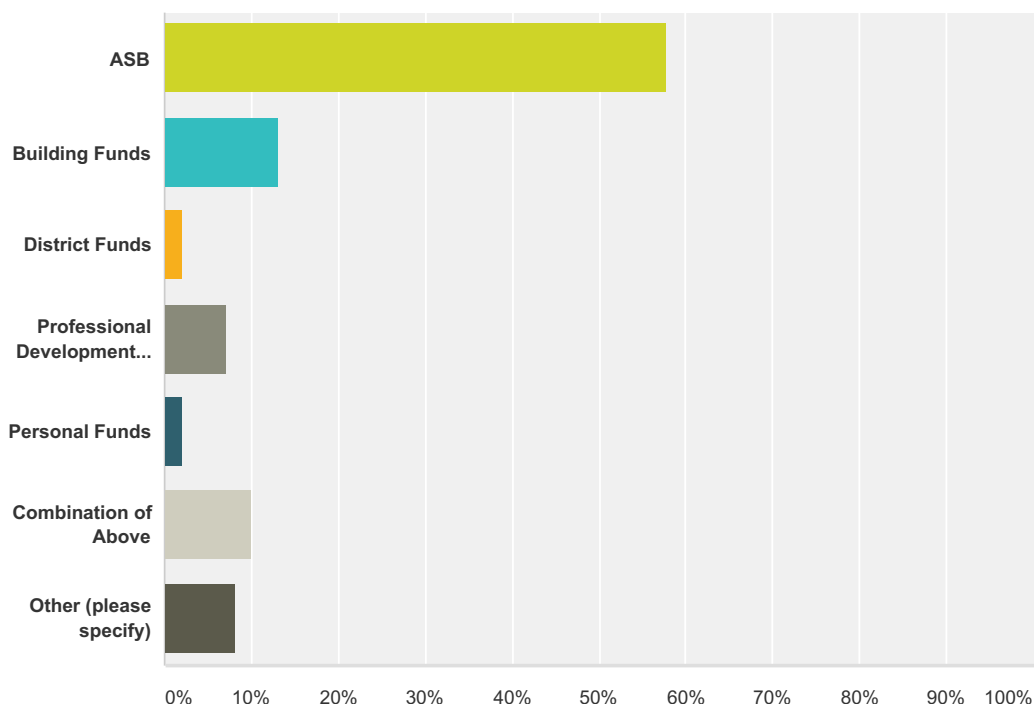

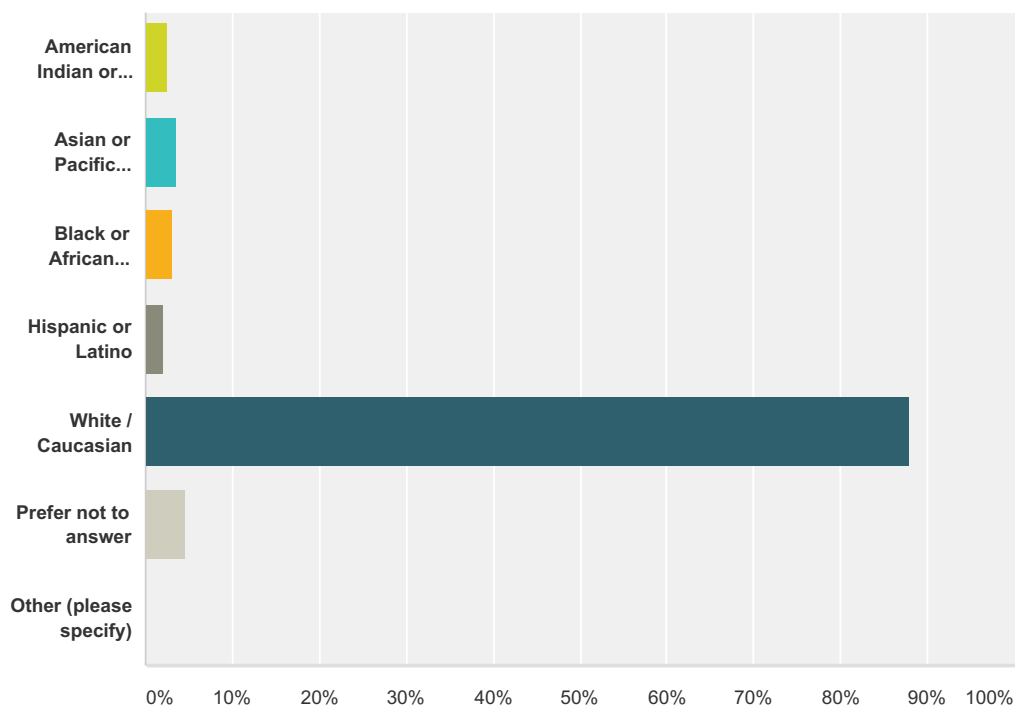

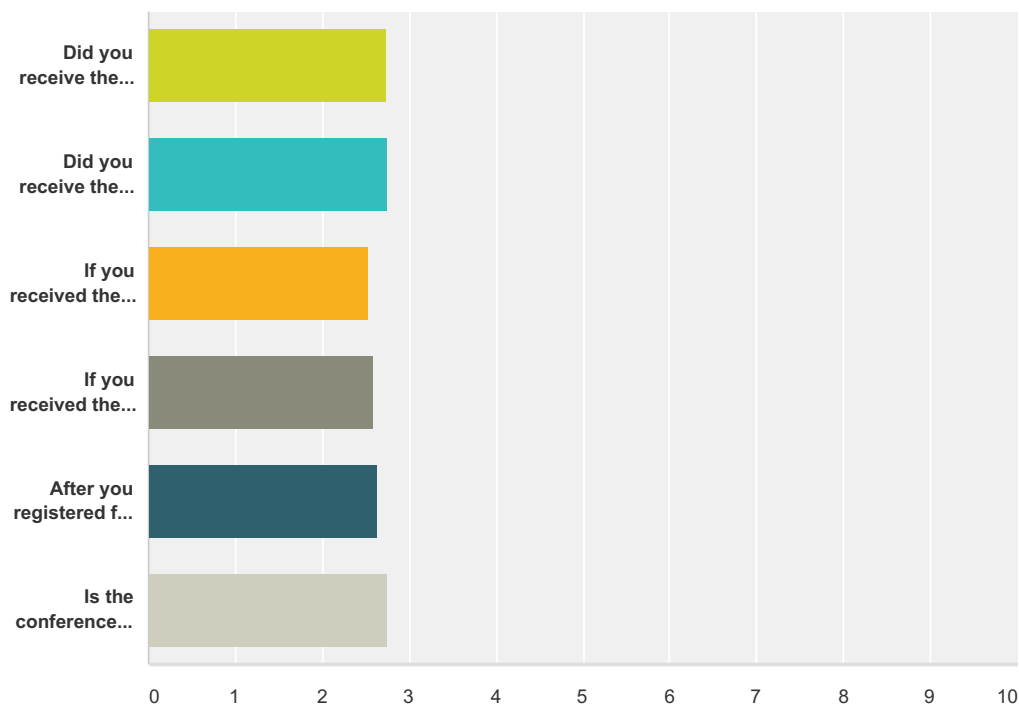

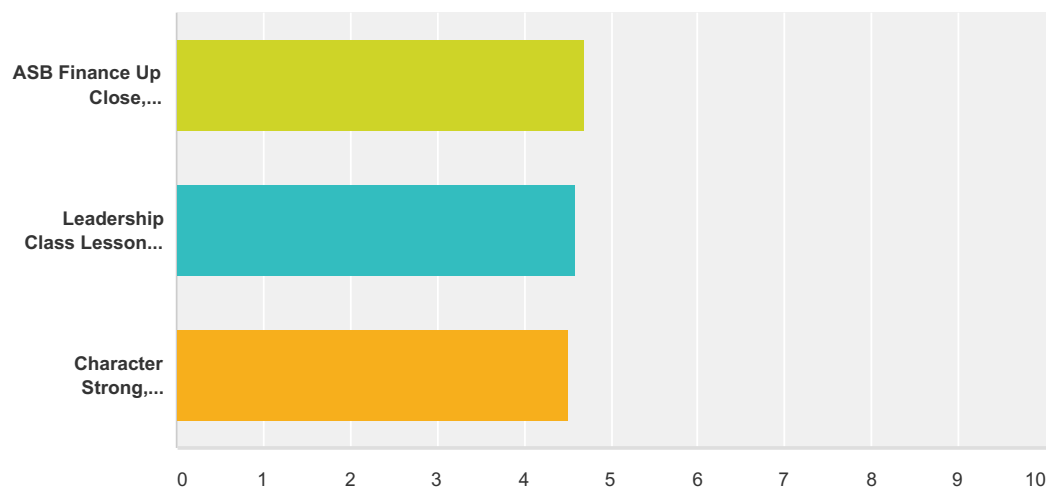

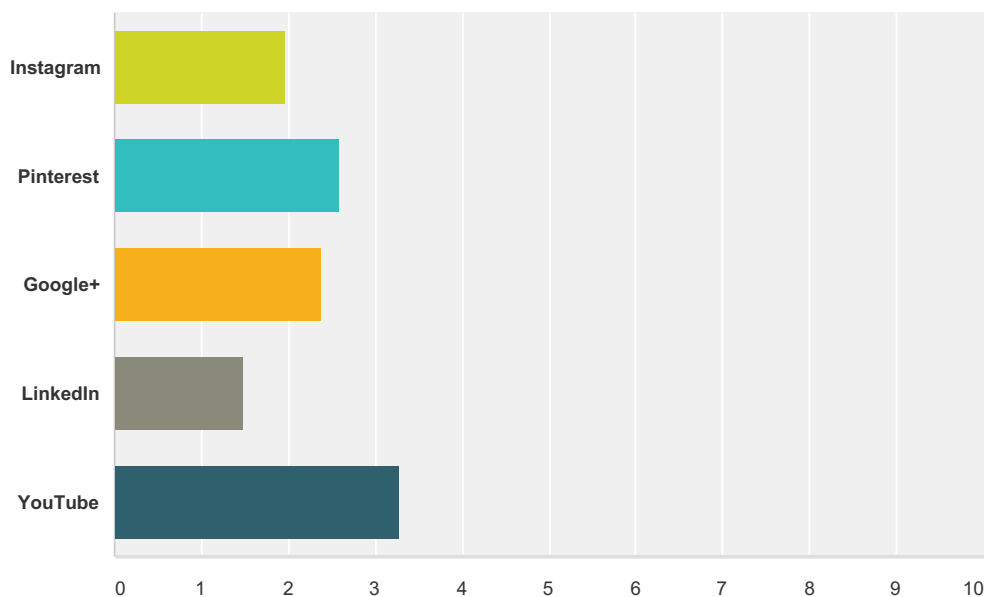

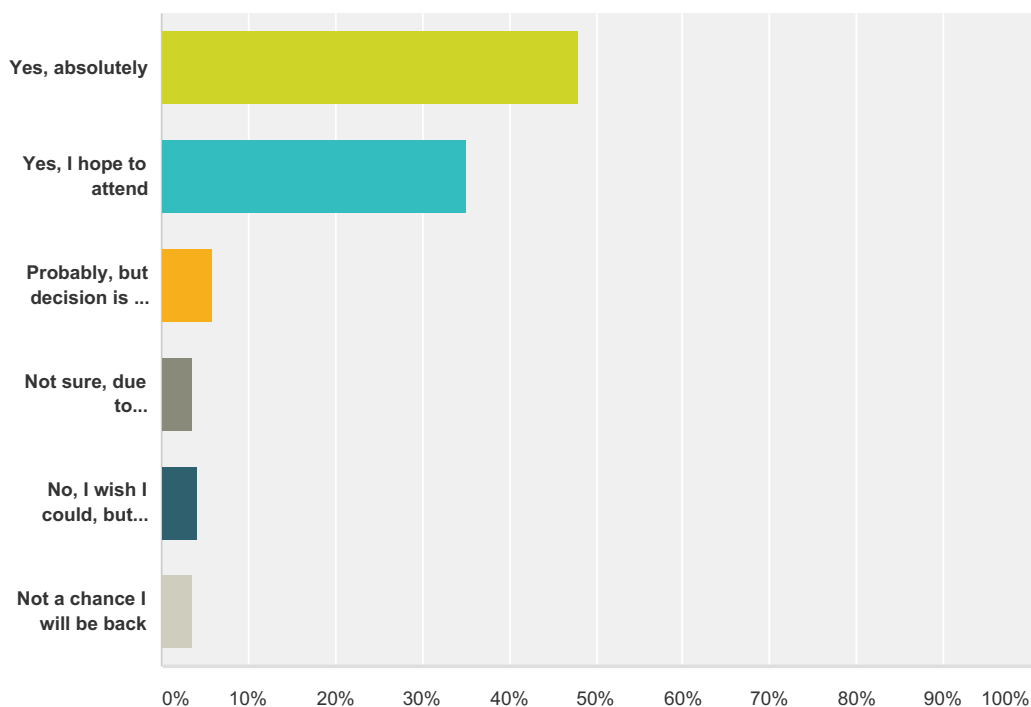
